Jo grew up in Northern Ireland where she graduated as a Bachelor of Science from the University of Ulster. During her spell as an undergraduate, Jo was Athletic Union President before being elected to the sabbatical role of Vice President, Sporting Clubs and Societies. During this time Jo was heavily involved in student sport through the British Universities Sports Federation (BUSF), and was the first student to manage a British Universities squad (hockey) and chair a BUSF sports panel.

After graduation, Jo moved to London where she worked for the Girl Guide Association before heading north to Edinburgh and a role as Sports Development Officer for the Scottish Canoe Association.
